I wasn't alone in noticing the remarkable turnout—more than a hundred self-advocates gathered for this year's Self-Advocacy Summit! The day opened with a powerful panel discussion with Secretary Carol Beatty and Tracy Wright, grounding the room in the decades of work that brought us to this moment.

After that, we caught up on the marriage panel! It was inspiring to hear the stories of married couples with disabilities. We tackled the honest topic of the barriers to marriage, but I walked away inspired by the love they shared.

Next, New Hope For All, led by Tavon, added to the day by providing insight on creating connections and establishing partnerships within the community. Their presentation was thoughtful, collaborative, and deeply committed to strengthening our community partnerships.

Toward the end, Tracy Wright and Ande Kolp took the stage to focus on the big question: Where do we go from here? We split into groups, and each group talked through their ideas for the future. There were plenty of twists and turns because everyone had different priorities, but in the end, we were able to put together a collective roadmap for what comes next.

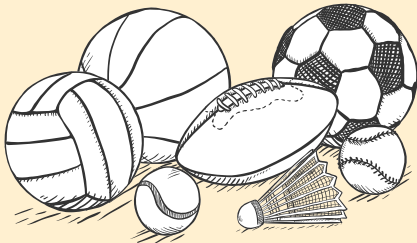

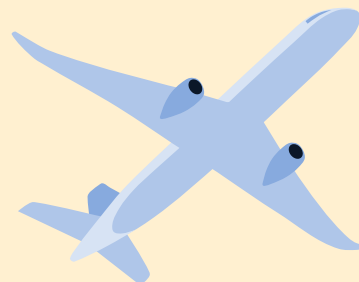

History Of Disability Pride Month:

Disability Pride Month is celebrated each July to recognize the disability community and the unique experiences, perspectives, and talents people with disabilities bring to our world. July marks the anniversary of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), the landmark civil rights law signed on July 26, 1990 that helped redefine disabilities. It was the first major step to break down barriers and create equal opportunities for all individuals with disabilities. Disability Pride Month reminds us how far we've come while continuing to advocate for a more inclusive and accessible future!

From the Maryland Developmental Disabilities Council:

The Maryland Department of Disabilities has set officially set an application window for the Accessible Boating Fund!

The program funds eligible 501(c)(3) nonprofits that offer accessible boating, sailing, kayaking, canoeing, paddleboarding, and other on-the-water recreational experiences for people with disabilities, service-disabled veterans, and eligible companions (such as family members or direct support professionals)

Applications for this year's funding cycle will be accepted from July 8 through August 7. Organizations interested in applying are encouraged to attend a Live Q&A Webinar on July 13 at 11:00 a.m. to learn more about the funding opportunity. [Read more and get webinar information here.](#)
