What is Maryland Partners in Policymaking®?

Take your advocacy to new heights through Partners in Policymaking®! Maryland's year-long program prepares adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD), parents, and family members of children and adults with IDD to **be effective advocates at the local, state, and federal levels.**

Since its creation in 1987 by the Minnesota Governor's Council on Developmental Disabilities, over 30,000 people have graduated from the program across over 30 states. **In Maryland, over 500 Partners alumni blanket the state.** They are involved in Commissions, serve on boards and workgroups, and are responsible for many of the positive changes we have seen over the years in our schools, workplaces, and community at large.

Each session of "Partners" features subject matter expert presentations and opportunities for discussion to **better equip participants for all aspects of your advocacy journey.** Partners is accessible, informative, and empowering.



Requirements

**You must be 18+ years old to apply!*

To participate, the Partners in Policymaking® program requires:

- A commitment to **attend** and participate in all **12 sessions**,
- An **interest in learning and practicing new skills and gaining knowledge** in a comfortable and safe environment,
- A **desire to partner, as part of a growing network** of people from diverse cultural backgrounds and life experiences,
- Completion of a **group or individual capstone project**, applying information gained to create positive change in Maryland.

Time Commitment

128 hours over a 1 year period of in-class participation, and asynchronous (on your own, outside of class) work

Location

The majority of the in-person sessions will take place in Howard County, Maryland. Additional sessions will take place in Annapolis, Maryland, and we may travel by bus or train to Washington, D.C. (TBD) for one class. All virtual sessions will be on Zoom.

Cost to Participants

There is **no fee for participants** to attend the sessions and take part in this opportunity. Maryland's program is made possible through a grant provided by the Maryland Developmental Disabilities Council, along with funding provided by The Arc Maryland, with programmatic support by People On the Go Maryland. Each spot in the program is valued at over \$5,000.

Overnight accommodations may be provided at no cost for those who drive a long distance to attend, as an accommodation to participate. Also included are meals, speakers' presentations and handouts, resource materials, publications, and accommodation services.

Accommodations

Participants who require accommodations for their participation should include these on their applications. These could include things like ASL, Child Care or Respite Stipends, Transportation Assistance, Technology, or Companion services (attendance of a family member or DSP to provide support to a Partners participant). Please note that we do not have on-site childcare and children are not allowed to attend classes with program participants. After each session, a homework assignment or review of materials that builds on and supports the topics addressed must be completed by each class member for discussion at the following session.



Presenters

Guest speakers are subject matter experts in the field as professionals, or through their own lived-experience with disability.

Selection Process

A review committee, which includes representatives from the Maryland Developmental Disabilities Council, People On the Go Maryland, and The Arc Maryland team, selects participants based on several criteria. Decisions will be made on September 18, 2026.
